

HEALTH CARE PROVISION REASONABLY REQUIRED

Health care provision reasonably required must be available through the local offer. It may include specialist support and therapies, such as:

- Medical treatments;
- Delivery of medications;
- Occupational therapy and physiotherapy;
- A range of nursing support;
- Specialist equipment;
- Wheelchairs;
- Continence supplies;
- Highly specialist services commissioned centrally by NHS England (eg therapeutic provision for young offenders in the secure estate);
- Other health care provision specified by the local authority and clinical commissioning group (CCG) as reasonably required by the child/young person, which is not linked to their learning difficulties or disabilities, but which should sensibly be coordinated with other services in the plan;
- Support for young people when moving from child to adult healthcare services.

The Health Service has duties to maintain the health care provision in a child/young person's Education, Health and Care Plan (see CoP, section 9.141).
