## **Question types**

**Open-ended** questions allow the respondent to give as much detail as seems relevant to them, eg 'What makes a lesson interesting to you?'

*Closed* questions put restrictions on the answer that is given. There are a range of closed question types that include:

- Simple 'yes' /'no' or 'true'/'false' type responses (eg 'Do you attend any after school clubs? yes/no')
- Information requests (eg 'What is your current age?', 'What subjects are you studying?')
- Multiple choice responses
  - (eg 'Which of the following subjects are you studying?
    - a) History
    - b) Geography
    - c) Business Studies
    - d) Psychology')
- Rating scales

(eg 'Homework improves research skills...

Agree strongly/agree/undecided/disagree/disagree strongly')

Ranking lists

(eg 'Place the following in order of importance to your study, where 1 is most important, 4 is least important...

- □ Time release from other duties
- □ Financial resources
- □ Physical resources
- □ Mentor support')
- Response Grids
